

**EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR
2018**

WHAT IS EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR?

- Special education program
- Preschool-POST Academy
- Prevent substantial regression of skills related to IEP goals
- Recommended by the IEP team based on the needs of the individual student

HOW ARE DECISION MADE?

- All children "regress"--lose progress, forget, revert to previous behavior--to some extent between school years. It must be determined whether a child's regression would likely be substantial, and whether the child would require a greater than usual time to "recoup"--to get back to the level the child had achieved before a break in service.
- In addition to significant regression and/or limited recoupment, courts have set forth other ESY criteria to be applied by a Team, as follows:
 - the degree of the child's impairment
 - the parents' ability to provide structure at home
 - the child's rate of progress
 - the child's specific behavior and/or physical problems
 - the availability of alternative resources
 - the child's ability to interact with non-disabled children
 - the specific curricular areas in which the child needs continuing attention
 - the vocational and transition needs of the child
 - whether the service requested is "extraordinary" rather than usual in consideration of the child's condition.

ESY PROGRAMS

- Programs (available at each level, as needed and appropriate):
 - Compass
 - Connections
 - Crossroads
 - TSP
 - Bridge
 - RISE
- Continuation of school year program
 - Direct social skills instruction embedded into the Connections and Compass programs
 - Life skills embedded into the Compass programs

ESY TUTORING

- Students who require academic instruction
- Each session will encompass reading, writing and math skills
- Students grouped by grade level
- Student work in small groups with a teacher or paraprofessional
- Each session (day) is 2 hours
- Students are recommended for 1-2 days per week

ANCILLARY SERVICES

- The IEP Team determines if OT, PT, Speech are required during ESY
- Special education teachers consult with therapists in order to embed these skills into the program
- Many ancillary services are delivered in small groups within the ESY classroom

- At the elementary level Kids' Club (extended day's full day child care) is located at the same school.
- Parent paid program
- Students can walk to Kids' Club from ESY
- Please tell your student's ESY teacher if he/she is participating in Kids' Club
